## AIS vendor ID

There are different types of [AIS](#) <sup>[1]</sup> units. For some of these units you can determine the vendor and sometimes the unit code.

The vendor list for [AIS](#) <sup>[1]</sup>-SART, [AIS](#) <sup>[1]</sup>-MOB and EPIRB can be found on the CIRM website by using this link <http://cirm.org/services/manufacture-ids.html> <sup>[2]</sup>

The vendor list used in msg 24 part B of [AIS](#) <sup>[1]</sup> available on the NMEA website. You can go to the NMEA website by following this [link](#) <sup>[3]</sup>. The unit codes are not available at the moment. The availability of a vendor-id in the lists will not guarantee that the units may be used yet. This is determined by [ITU](#) <sup>[5]</sup>, [IMO](#) <sup>[6]</sup> and in some parts by local legislation. Using units that are not certified for their purpose and permitted by legislation could result in a penalty by using them or by detection by an official body.
